LIFELINE THEATRE ANNOUNCES 2017-2018 SEASON OF BIG STORIES, UP CLOSE: 35TH SEASON FEATURES FOUR WORLD PREMIERES AND TWO RETURNING HITS, PLUS THE 21ST ANNUAL FILLET OF SOLO FESTIVAL AND THE LIFELINE CONCERT READING SERIES.

CHICAGO – **Lifeline Theatre** Artistic Director **Dorothy Milne** and the artistic ensemble announce their **35**th **Anniversary Season** of *Big Stories, Up Close.* It's a year of unforgettable stories brought to life, from timeless classics to thrilling modern tales, as Lifeline retains its reputation for imaginative interpretations of beloved novels. Both the MainStage and KidSeries seasons celebrate Lifeline's milestone 35th Anniversary with one world premiere production by a long-time Lifeline mainstay, a world premiere by one of the company's newest ensemble members, and the return of one of the most popular hits of the past decade.

The 2017-18 MainStage season features a world premiere adaptation of the comedic romance, "Sylvester: or the Wicked Uncle;" followed by a world premiere adaptation of the sweeping Russian drama, "Anna Karenina;" and concludes with the return of Lifeline's award-winning adaptation of the epic urban fantasy, "Neverwhere." The KidSeries season opens with the hit musical, "Arnie The Doughnut;" followed by "Montauciel Takes Flight," a world premiere musical inspired by the true story of the first animals to fly in a hot air balloon; and concludes with a funky and fun world premiere musical adaptation of "You Think It's Easy Being The Tooth Fairy?" Additionally, Lifeline Theatre will produce the 21st annual Fillet of Solo Festival, a three-week, multi-venue solo performance and storytelling festival; and the 2017-18 Concert Reading Series will feature Terry Pratchett's Monstrous Regiment, readings from the works of Edgar Allan Poe, and a pairing of Dylan Thomas' A Child's Christmas in Wales and Truman Capote's A Christmas Memory.

Season subscriptions offer the three MainStage productions for \$80 (a \$120 value), or the three KidSeries plays for \$30 (a \$45 value). Passes to the Fillet of Solo Festival may be added to any subscription for only \$25 (a \$50 value; allows entry to all performances in the 2018 Festival). Being a Lifeline subscriber allows patrons to save 33% off regular ticket prices; offers discounts on additional tickets and reduced admission to the Concert Reading Series; offers discounts to drama camp registration; and gives first choice of seats with unlimited free ticket exchanges.

Lifeline continues its popular "Book Club Add-ons," which include paperback copies of three source books for the MainStage season (*Sylvester: or the Wicked Uncle*, *Anna Karenina*, and *Neverwhere*) for \$30, or hard cover copies of two source books for the KidSeries season (*Arnie the Doughnut* and *You Think It's Easy Being The Tooth Fairy?*) for \$30. Read the books beforehand and then experience Lifeline's adaptation. Copies of the source books for the MainStage and KidSeries seasons will be on sale in the lobby, as will cast recordings of selected musical productions.

Lifeline Theatre also offers fun and educational programming for children. Lifeline presents three *Library Days* at the Rogers Park Branch of the Chicago Public Library (6907 N. Clark St.). These <u>FREE</u> events for children ages 4 and up feature read-alongs from a KidSeries book with interactive drama games. Additionally, Lifeline continues its "*Stories Come Alive!*" series, running Saturdays and Sundays at 12 p.m., between regularly-scheduled KidSeries performances. These hour-long sessions cost only \$5 per child, and feature readings, on-your-feet drama games, and fun to supplement the KidSeries productions. An additional add-on for KidSeries Subscriptions is admission to one "Stories Come Alive!" hour during each KidSeries production for only \$10 (a \$15 value).

Ticket prices for the 2017-2018 season are as follows: regular single MainStage tickets are \$40; seniors, active and retired military personnel (with ID), and groups (12 or more) are \$30; previews, students (with ID) and rush tickets (half-hour before show, subject to availability) are \$20. Lifeline's KidSeries single tickets for adults and kids are \$15 each; and groups of 15 or more are \$10 each. "Name Your Price" KidSeries tickets are available a half-hour before show time (subject to availability).

Lifeline Theatre is located at 6912 N. Glenwood Ave. in Chicago's Rogers Park neighborhood. Lifeline is accessible by CTA (Red Line Morse stop/busses) and free parking is available at the Field School parking lot (7019 N. Ashland St., entrance on Greenleaf between Ashland and Greenview) with free shuttle service before and after the show. Street parking is also available. Lifeline is accessible to wheelchair users and visitors who need to avoid stairs.

Founded in 1982, Lifeline is known for staging innovative adaptations of great works of fiction as well as commissioning original work. In 1987, Lifeline added KidSeries plays for children and families, and has been producing full seasons of programming for both adults and children ever since. Over the course of **thirty-four seasons** and nearly **two hundred productions**, Lifeline Theatre has made not only an indelible mark on the Chicago theatre scene, but an invaluable contribution to the theatre world at large. Lifeline's dedicated artistic ensemble has developed over **one hundred world premiere literary adaptations** and **thirteen original plays**, more than thirty of which have had a life beyond their Lifeline premieres, with nearly **three hundred subsequent productions** spread across over forty U.S. states, six Canadian provinces, plus productions in England, Ireland, Australia, and Guatemala. Additionally, three scripts developed at Lifeline Theatre have gone on to U.S. national tours, and over a dozen have been published. Lifeline Theatre has garnered a total of **fifty-one Jeff Awards** (Equity and Non-Equity), including fourteen for New Adaptation or New Work, and **twenty-one After Dark Awards**.

Lifeline Theatre is driven by a passion for story. Our ensemble process supports writers in the development of literary adaptations and new work, and our theatrical and educational programs foster a lifelong engagement with literature and the arts. A cultural anchor of Rogers Park, we are committed to deepening our connection to an evergrowing family of artists and audiences, both near and far.

Sylvester, Duke of Salford, was born with wealth and good looks, but a life of privilege has rendered him unfeeling towards others. Phoebe Marlow was graced with a sparkling wit and independent spirit, but languishes under the thumb of her domineering stepmother. When this mismatched couple is thrust together by their meddling families, both rebel and their tidy little worlds spin into chaos. Midnight flights, desperate sea voyages, and scathing society hijinks ensue as these unlikely lovers labor to avoid their fate.
