**LIFELINE THEATRE ANNOUNCES 25<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY SEASON**  
**SIX WORLD PREMIERE ADAPTATIONS FOR ADULTS & KIDS IN 2007-2008**  
**TO RECEIVE SPECIAL JEFF CITATION ON JUNE 11**  
**FOR DEDICATION TO COMMUNITY AND NEW WORK**

CHICAGO, IL, Tuesday, May 15, 2007— Artistic Director Dorothy Milne and the artistic ensemble of Lifeline Theatre announce their 2007-2008 season, a quarter century of presenting “*Big Stories, Up Close.*” To celebrate their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, all MainStage tickets will be \$25 this season. The Joseph Jefferson Awards Committee will present a Special Citations award to Lifeline Theatre at the Jeff Awards Citations Ceremony on June 11, 2007, for their contribution to theatre over the years, as “*a mainstay of Chicago’s non-union theatre community and dedication to presenting new material. Lifeline Theatre specializes in original literary adaptations, using imaginative, unconventional staging to portray sprawling stories in an intimate space. The theatre aspires to be a creative nest for new work that reflects and engages our community.*”

In its award-winning and audience-acclaimed style, Lifeline’s 2007-2008 season will explore the heights and depths of love, horror and heroism via six best-selling books onstage in world premiere adaptations by Lifeline ensemble members. Both MainStage and KidSeries will feature two expansive, classic tales and one intriguing, contemporary title, as Lifeline retains its reputation for fresh, imaginative interpretations of well-loved stories and embraces the challenge and excitement of new, thought-provoking works. The MainStage season will begin with science gone too far in **THE ISLAND OF DR. MOREAU**, followed by the contemporary love story **TALKING IT OVER**, and concluding with a new look at the legendary tale, **THE MARK OF ZORRO**. Founded in 1982, Lifeline is known for staging innovative adaptations of great and popular works of fiction as well as commissioning original work. In 1987, Lifeline added KidSeries plays for children and families, and has been producing full seasons of programming for both adults and children ever since. The KidSeries season offerings will begin with the popular classic **HALF MAGIC**, followed by the beloved tale **LYLE, LYLE, CROCODILE** and concluding with the new discovery **THE DIRTY COWBOY**.

This 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary year will feature Lifeline’s ensemble members in new ways on the MainStage. Award-winning actor and adaptor of last year’s KidSeries hit, **THE TRUE STORY OF THE 3 LITTLE PIGS!**, ensemble member Robert Kauzlaric leaps to the challenge of adapting for the MainStage with **THE ISLAND OF DR. MOREAU**, directed by ensemble member Paul S. Holmquist in his MainStage directorial debut, and featuring ensemble member Phil Timberlake as the terrorized Edward Prendick. Award-winning actor and ensemble member Peter Greenberg will debut as adaptor with **TALKING IT OVER** featuring ensemble member Elise Kauzlaric onstage as the apex of a painful love triangle. A familiar face on the Lifeline stage and critically-acclaimed director of **JOHNNY TREMAIN**, ensemble member Katie McLean puts on the adapting hat for the first time with **THE MARK OF ZORRO**.
