LIFELINE THEATRE ANNOUNCES 2019-2020 SEASON OF BIG STORIES, UP CLOSE: 37TH SEASON FEATURES THREE WORLD PREMIERES AND TWO REVIVALS, PLUS THE 23rd ANNUAL FILLET OF SOLO FESTIVAL.

CHICAGO – **Lifeline Theatre** Artistic Director **Ilesa Duncan** and the artistic ensemble announce their 2019-20 season of *Big Stories, Up Close.* It's another year of unforgettable stories brought to life, from beloved classics to modern titles.

The 2019-20 MainStage season features a return of Dorothy L. Sayers' classic whodunit *Whose Body?*, followed by an epic adaptation of National Book Award winner *Middle Passage*, and concludes with a world premiere rock musical based on Norse mythology *LOKI*, *The End of the World Tour*. The KidSeries season opens with our musical adaptation of Bernard Waber's beloved classic *Lyle*, *Lyle*, *Crocodile*; followed by the world premiere of *Bunny's Book Club*; and concludes with a world premiere musical adaptation of *Neither*, a story that celebrates what makes us unique. Additionally, Lifeline Theatre will produce the 23rd annual **Fillet of Solo Festival**, a three-week, multi-venue solo performance and storytelling festival.

Lifeline continues its popular "Book Club Add-ons," which include copies of all three source books for the MainStage season for only \$35 (paperback versions of *Whose Body?*, *Middle Passage*, and *The Penguin Book of Norse Myths: Gods of the Vikings*), or copies of all three source books for the KidSeries season for \$40 (paperback version of *Lyle, Lyle, Crocodile* and hardcover versions of *Bunny's Book Club* and *Neither*). Read the books beforehand and then experience Lifeline's adaptation. Copies of the source books for the MainStage and KidSeries seasons will be on sale in the lobby.

An additional add-on for KidSeries Subscriptions is admission to one "Stories Come Alive!" hour during each KidSeries production for only \$10 (a \$15 value). These hour-long sessions (running Saturdays and Sundays at 12 p.m., between regularly-scheduled KidSeries performances) feature readings, on-your-feet drama games, and fun to supplement the KidSeries productions.

Ticket prices for the 2019-2020 season are as follows: regular single MainStage tickets are \$45; seniors and groups (12 or more) are \$35; previews, and rush tickets (half-hour before show, subject to availability) are \$25; students (with ID) and active and retired military personnel (with ID) are \$20. Lifeline's KidSeries single tickets for adults are \$20 and kids (ages 2-18) are \$15; and groups of 15 or more are \$13 each. "Name Your Price" KidSeries tickets are available a half-hour before show time (subject to availability).

Lifeline Theatre is located at 6912 N. Glenwood Ave. in Chicago's Rogers Park neighborhood. Lifeline is accessible by CTA (Red Line Morse stop/busses) and free parking is available at Sullivan High School (6631 N Bosworth Ave, lot located on the corner of Albion and Bosworth) with free shuttle service before and after the show. Street parking is also available. Lifeline is accessible to wheelchair users and visitors who need to avoid stairs.

Founded in 1982, Lifeline is known for staging innovative adaptations of great works of fiction as well as commissioning original work. In 1987, Lifeline added KidSeries plays for children and families, and has been producing full seasons of programming for both adults and children ever since. Over the course of **thirty-six seasons** and **two hundred productions**, Lifeline Theatre has made not only an indelible mark on the Chicago theatre scene, but an invaluable contribution to the theatre world at large. Lifeline's dedicated artistic ensemble has developed **one hundred and forty-three world premiere literary adaptations and original plays**, nearly forty of which have had a life beyond their Lifeline premieres, with over **three hundred subsequent productions** spread across over forty U.S. states, six Canadian provinces, plus productions in England, Ireland, Australia, South Africa, and Guatemala. Additionally, four scripts developed at Lifeline Theatre have gone on to U.S. national tours, and over a dozen have been published. Lifeline Theatre has garnered a total of **fifty-three Jeff Awards** (Equity and Non-Equity), including sixteen for New Adaptation, New Musical, or New Work.

Lifeline Theatre is driven by a passion for story. Our ensemble process supports writers in the development of literary adaptations and new work, and our theatrical and educational programs foster a lifelong engagement with literature and the arts. A cultural anchor of Rogers Park, we are committed to deepening our connection to an evergrowing family of artists and audiences, both near and far.

When a dead body turns up in a bathtub wearing nothing but a pair of pince-nez, amateur detective Lord Peter Wimsey assigns himself to the case. However, when the mystery becomes labyrinthine he enlists the help of close friend Inspector Parker to follow his only lead, a teaching hospital near the scene of the crime. Could it be a harmless prank by a medical student or something more sinister? Follow the clues and uncover the truth in this beloved 1923 whodunit by Dorothy L. Sayers.

Ensemble member **Frances Limoncelli**, adaptor of 2009's *Busman's Honeymoon* (Non-Equity Jeff Award: New Adaptation), 2006's *Gaudy Night* (Non-Equity Jeff Award: New Adaptation), and 2004's *Strong Poison* (Non-Equity Jeff Awards: New Adaptation) re-explores this beloved and charming whodunit for a new generation.

Middle Passage is an epic work adapted from Charles Johnson's celebrated book of the same name. Written for the stage by David Barr, III and Ilesa Duncan, the story follows cavalier, self-confessed rascal Rutherford Calhoun, a recently freed slave, from Illinois down to decadent 1830 New Orleans. In an attempt to escape debtors and avoid a forced marriage, he stows away on an outbound rigger, The Republic. But The Republic is not just any ship. It's a slave ship—and it's headed to Africa. Thus begins a voyage of self-discovery that changes our young hero forever.

Co-adaptors **David Barr, III** and **Ilesa Duncan**, Lifeline Artistic Director, revisit Johnson's epic tale, originally mounted at Pegasus Theatre in 2016 under the title *Rutherford's Travels*, to share a tale of personal growth within a dark phase of American history. Of *Middle Passage*, the Chicago Tribune said, "Long after we'd stopped believing in the great American novel, along comes a spellbinding adventure story that may be just that."
